

WALLACE PARK PRECINCT

Familiarisation Tour July 19, 2019

GENERAL INFORMATION

At 9 am, fifteen of our lovely Vollies met outside the Noosaville Library with Jane Harding (Heritage Librarian), our guide for a tour of some of the facilities at Wallace Park (more about Jane later).

The land that comprises Wallace Park and contains Wallace House stands on was originally owned by Walter Hay; the original house he had built burned down, and Arthur Wallace bought a section of the land in 1930 and built the current house.

The Wallace family moved out in 1980, and Wallace House became a

rental property with a variety of tenants including, it is rumoured, some running a brothel and casino! For a fuller history of Wallace House, click here.

Wallace Park was opened to the public in 1993. Today, the 90,000 square metre precinct includes

Noosa Parks Association's Environment Centre, Wallace House, Noosa Leisure Centre, Noosaville Library, Noosa Bridge Club, Tewantin-Noosa Meals on Wheels, Noosa Community Support Centre and the Endeavour Foundation. Our group was given a tour of the first four of these.

NOOSA PARKS ASSOCIATION ENVIRONMENT CENTRE

The Environment Centre building (constructed by Noosa Parks Association in 1993) is the focus of the Association's social life, as well as the venue for many of its educational and recreational facilities. It is open to members and the public on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 10am to 2pm. Visitors and members are welcome to join the various NPA activities, which are hosted by volunteers.

The Centre contains much information (pictorial and written) about the Noosa environment.





NOOSA PARKS ASSOCIATION ENVIRONMENT CENTRE - cont'd

There are many photos of local wildlife, birds, plants and weeds. The history of The NPA's conservation struggles and achievements since 1962 are also documented.

The NPA has many activity groups focussing on bird observation, botany, bushwalking and greening Noosa, to mention just a few; follow this NPA link to find more information. There is a regular Friday Environment Forum available to anyone who is interested. Invited guest speakers cover a range of current conservation and environmental issues.





NOOSA ARTS AND CRAFTS – WALLACE HOUSE

Noosa Council bought Wallace House in 1992 as a home for Noosa Shire Arts and Crafts. It was damaged by fire in 1999, taking two years to repair, and has since had many successful years of hosting workshops, courses and seminars in a wide variety of arts and crafts.

Did you know ??

An important landmark for indigenous people is the deciduous white fig tree that you'll find while strolling through *Tewantin's Memorial Park*. The enormous tree is over 30 metres tall and between 200 to 400 years old and was once an indigenous burial tree.

The name of Noosa's hinterland town of *Cooroy*, originally spelt Coorooey, is derived from the language of the Kabi Kabi people meaning possum.



Cootharaba, the name of Noosa's largest lake, is the aboriginal word for the place where the wood used in making notched or studded clubs is found.

Kin Kin, the name of a small village in Noosa's hinterland, is from the Kabi Kabi word kauin kauin meaning red soil. It also refers to a species of small black ant prevalent in the area.

Cooran is the word for tall trees and a tranquil Noosa country town is now named after it. Once a year for two days, the Tall Tree Art Festival takes place in the village.

In Kabi Kabi language, *Tinbeerwah* means place of grass trees or high hill climbing up. There is a mountain called Tinbeerwah, located just 15 minutes from Noosa Heads, in the Tewantin National Park.

For thousands of years, the Kabi Kabi people were one of the two host tribes for the great Bunya Nut Festival, which attracted many indigenous groups from distant areas and was an important social gathering. The Bunya Tree is an iconic tree of South East Queensland bearing spiky, football-sized fruit which taste similar to chestnuts or potatoes. While the tree is nowadays referred to as Bunya Tree, it is known as Bunyi/ Bonyi in the local Kabi Kabi language.
